Face coverings no longer mandatory but preferable. Come in appropriate clothing for easy access to upper arm whilst having your vaccination. Read the notice board outside that gives further instructions. Do not enter the building if you have any Covid symptoms. The appointment allocated to you is just 2.5 minutes, so the time you have to spend in surgery is short.

Welcome to Downing Drive Surgery's Patient Participation Group Newsletter.



ALL ABOUT APPOINTMENTS

The surgery is settling in with new ways of working now that consultations can be done via telephone or face to face. We have had mixed responses to our GP telephone triage



system. We wish to reassure patients that if a physical examination is needed, then the GP or Nurse Practitioner will ask you to come down to the surgery to see them following their triage of your symptoms. The appointment system is managed to maximise the capacity as best we can to accommodate the demand. This is also the reason office staff will ask you what your reason is for wanting an appointment so you can talk to or be seen with the most appropriate clinician with the specialist knowledge and triaged appropriately depending on the urgency of your problem. Doctors Corner - Minor Surgery

We continue to operate a regular Minor Surgery clinic performed by Dr Ahmad and Dr Sahota. We remove skin lesions causing discomfort or pain including skin tags, cysts, ganglions and other lumps and bumps. Whilst we appreciate that some patients would sometimes like something removing because it is unsightly, unfortunately we are not

able to offer this service as the NHS regards this as a cosmetic procedure.

If you feel you have a problem which could be helped by a minor surgery procedure, please book a consultation with a GP to assess its suitability and to discuss any risks of the procedure. Please also be aware that the final decision to perform a Minor Surgical Procedure is with the operating doctor on the day of the procedure.
